If you haven't read "The Secret Garden" by Frances Hodgson Burnett recently (or ever), let me be the one to recommend it to you. While I first encountered it some years ago as child, I'm currently reading it with my daughter, and the both of us have a hard time when we have to put it down. If you're unfamiliar with the tale, "The Secret Garden" is a delightfully simple, incredibly poignant tale of children embracing a literal springtime in their lives for the first time. Misselthwaite Manor, where the story takes place, is set on the moors of Yorkshire, England, and is a dark, cold, dreary and unhappy place. But with the arrival of a young orphan, Mary, from India, this barren-seeming home and land begin (with some struggles) to unfurl new leaves of life, joy and laughter. Why do I think you should pick up a children's story,

you ask? Because for one thing, May is a glorious time to read any story that speaks so eloquently of the approach of spring, and shares such an unbridled joy at the coming of new life. For another, although it is not a 'spiritual' book in a traditional sense, there are strong parallels to be seen in the story, and in our Christian life. The whole of our Easter season is a trumpeting of the victory of Christ over death! As the grey stone of the tomb gives way to the richness of life-giving love in our scriptures, so too does the coming of spring over the English moors bring with it the promise of hope and new life for those thought to be dead in spirit. Would that we all embrace the victory of the Resurrection, and the joy of Pentecost with the same rapturous and childlike joy as the characters in this story!

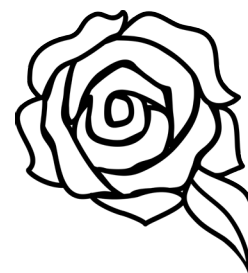
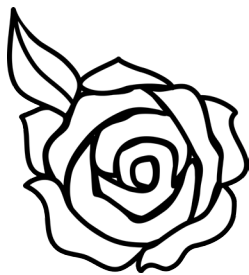

We pray for our mothers, who have given us life and love, that we may show them reverence and love.

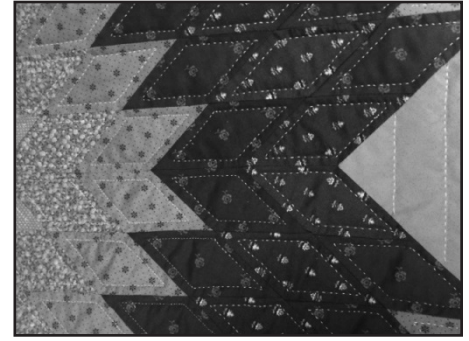
We pray for mothers who have lost a child through death, that their faith may give them hope, and their family and friends support and console them.

A Note of the Patriotic Rosary

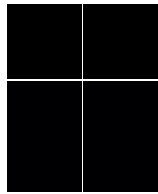
