

Currently he is working on a book about angels.

Father Longenecker is always pleased to get out and meet the Catholics who keep our church going –the ordinary folks in the pews. He often tells his conversion story –how he went from being a student at Bob Jones University to being a Catholic priest. He likes to speak on the threats to a positive, joyful Catholicism in the world today, Benedictine spirituality, and the Hero's quest of faith.

He was ordained in 2006. He moved his family from England to Greenville, South Carolina and accepted a post as chaplain to St. Joseph's Catholic School. He is now pastor of Our Lady of the Rosary parish in Greenville.
