

PROGRAM BACKGROUND

Through research and education, Thomas W. Hilgers, MD, developed the **Creighton Model FertilityCare System** and the new women's health science of **NaProTechnology**. Dr. Hilgers is the founder and director of the Pope Paul VI Institute for the Study of Human Reproduction and clinical professor in the Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology, Creighton University Medical Center. The Pope Paul VI Institute, founded in 1985, is internationally recognized for its outstanding achievements in the field of natural fertility regulation and reproductive medicine .

Catholic Diocese of Wichita FertilityCare Services is a part of the Diocesan Natural Family Planning Program and has a long-standing tradition of excellence in teaching. Students who train as FertilityCare Professionals attend the Education Program to learn to assist couples and women seeking a better understanding of their own fertility and to advocate for their gynecological health.

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The **FertilityCare™ Services Diocese of Wichita Practitioner Education Program**

is a 13-month program that will prepare students to:

- * Help couples understand their gifts of sexuality and fertility.
- * Teach women and couples to navigate their fertility over their procreative lifetime.
- * Provide comprehensive, professional and individualized family planning services.
- * Assist infertile couples with achieving a pregnancy in a way that is natural and cooperative.
- * Work in an allied health profession dedicated to ongoing research and development.

Course Structure

Only faculty certified and approved present the course in **two education phases** and **two supervised practicum**. Students also complete an onsite visit with their supervisor and take a final certificate examination.

Education Phase I (EPI)

June 4-11, 2016

Wichita, KS (The Spiritual Life Center)

EPI is an eight-day immersion course focused on basic teaching skills of the Creighton Model **FertilityCare™** System (CrMS). Topics include anatomy, physiology, contraception and NFP methods, chart reading and correcting, use of standardized tools, system instructions and techniques of follow up.

Supervised Practicum I (SPI)

June 2016 – December 2016

Practitioner's home location

During SPI, students teach a minimum of six clients in their home location. Students work under the direction of a long-distance supervisor to develop basic teaching skills in the CrMS.

Education Phase II (EPII)

December 4-11, 2016

Wichita, KS (The Spiritual Life Center)

EPII is a six-day immersion course focused on advanced teaching skills of the CrMS. Topics include infertility, NaProTechnology, unusual bleeding, continuous mucus, pregnancies, advanced behavior issues and a client case review.

Supervised Practicum II (SPII)

December 2016 – June 2017

Practitioner's home location

During SPII, students teach a minimum of 12 additional clients (for 18 clients during the 13-month program) in their home location. Students work under the direction of a supervisor to refine basic skills and develop advanced teaching skills in the CrMS.

On-Site Visit (OSV)

February 1- April 30, 2016

Practitioner's home location

During the On-Site Visit (OSV), the supervisor travels to the student's home location for two days to evaluate the student's teaching skills and conduct a client case review.

Final Certificate Exam

August 19, 2017

In order to become an independent **FertilityCare™ Practitioner**, students take a final certificate examination upon completion of all program requirements.

Accreditation and Affiliation

The **FertilityCare™ Services Diocese of Wichita Practitioner Education Program**, accredited by the American Academy of **FertilityCare™** Professionals (AAFPCP), and provides students with necessary education for certification from the AAFPCP.

Application Deadline and Qualifications

The application deadline is April 29, 2016.

Applications received after this date will incur a \$150 late fee.

The **FertilityCare™ Services Diocese of Wichita Practitioner Education Program** welcomes applications from individuals with a strong motivation and commitment to exceptional **FertilityCare™ Services**. Class size is limited and early submission of an application will allow adequate study time of the advance books and materials.

The **FertilityCare™ Services Diocese of Wichita Practitioner Education Program** cannot accept applications after **May 15, 2016**.

Prospective Practitioners must meet one of the following criteria:

- Registered Nurse with current license
- Individual with a BA or BS degree
- Associate degree/diploma, such as: Licensed Practical Nurse; Human Services Practitioner or the equivalent of two years of college study

Further eligibility criteria requires that the applicant does not prescribe or refer for contraceptives, does not perform or refer for sterilization or abortion, practices (uses) natural family planning or, if single and celibate, monitors their natural fertility and is a philosophical acceptor of natural family planning.

COURSE FEES

All tuition costs are due upon entry into the program. A \$225 tuition deposit is required to secure your enrollment in the class. Scholarships are available for CDOW Practitioner Interns. Please contact the Director for information.

Costs for the program:

Application Fee \$25
(\$175 if received after April 29, 2016)
Tuition : \$2, 250
Textbooks: \$450
Facility and Meals Fee: \$600(\$40/day; 8 days at EPI & 6 days at EPII)

Practitioners may also incur the following costs:

On-Site Visit during SPII-travel expenses and one night hotel for supervisor if not in Wichita.
Client supplies (Approximate cost \$450 if starting new Center; reimbursable through client fees)
